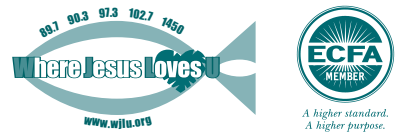

Over the last few months we have been working on several projects. You have heard the sayings "Talk is cheap", "Show me the money," "Tell me something new," "Will this be in my lifetime?" and "I'm from Missouri." One of my favorites is "better late than never." Well, I am happy to report better late than never. With a little help from our friends, we have a fresh coat of paint on the old barn inside. We added some chair rail, painted all the woodwork, and all the walls. It really looks beautiful, good as new. The proof is in the pudding. Stop by and see for yourself. Beauty is in the eye of the beholder. The carpet has all been replaced, (which was long overdue) thanks to Diversified Flooring.

The Root Street project is finished. I think we made a silk purse out of a sow's ear. We went from the neighborhood eyesore to the jewel of the Nile. The long anticipated ground system improvement was completed. We need to find a tenant to help us recoup the cost of the renovations that was not in our budget. The inside is still unfinished but would make for great storage. We were hoping to be able to let a ministry use the building at no cost but we need to recover the savings we spent to renovate. Our goal was always for someone to renovate it at their cost in exchange for the use of the building. We still would entertain a reduced rent tenant in exchange for their finishing the inside. You can't fight city hall so the City of Daytona will be pleased at what we have accomplished.

Saving the best for last, I am happy to report we have been granted a construction permit for WJLH 90.3 for 15,000 watts. Currently we are at 2000 watts. We have been praying for this for a long time, better late than never. We ask you to continue to pray, however, because we are trying for 25,000 watts but praise the Lord that no matter what happens we are guaranteed the 15KW. Remember, this doesn't mean we can just flip a switch and go from 2kw to 15kw. We can't get the cart before the horse. Money has to be raised, equipment (with a long lead time) must be ordered. Rome wasn't built in a day. We hope to turn the power up in 2009. Don't forget, we have to walk before we can run.

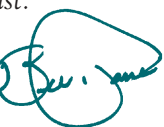

I was having some repairs done at my house the other day when one of the workers knocked on my door. "Excuse me," the man said "someone said you work at the Christian radio station." I told him that is true and he said "Yeah, you all play Don Francisco and I just wanted to share my testimony with you." I listened as he proceeded to tell me how he had met Don Francisco after a concert one night and Don handed him a Bible. He read it and from this he became a Christian. Hmm... how strange that must seem in these days of man-centered religion. Without being emotionally stirred with music, without being told the words to the "sinner's prayer," this man had come to faith in Christ with nothing more than God's Word.

Many years ago, I attended a meeting after church one night. I listened as the pastor gave us instructions for the alter call. "People are afraid" he said, "and they don't know what to do so if you see someone go to the alter, go join them. Also it would be good if some of you would also go to the alter when the invitation is given because if they see others going, then they will feel more comfortable to go too." At the time I didn't know why but something about that really bothered me. Now I know what it was.

Do we have so little confidence in the power of God that we believe He needs our manipulative tactics to save a soul? No wonder so many membership cards are signed!
